


ACCELERATED MASTER'S 4+1/4+2

Niagara University's accelerated and 4+1/4+2 master's degree programs allow undergraduate students to take graduate-level courses that count toward both their bachelor's and master's degrees. Students can begin taking graduate coursework before officially starting a graduate degree. Check with the graduate program advisor on the number of courses allowed. Students may pursue a graduate degree that differs from their undergraduate major. The minimum requirement for most of the accelerated programs is a 3.0 GPA.

- Easier transition: the program allows students to start taking graduate courses during their senior year (you can even apply during your junior year with approval from department).
- Shortened timeframe: students can obtain an undergraduate and a graduate degree in much less time than it takes to complete separate degrees (4+1 = 4 years of undergrad plus 1 year of graduate school or 4+2 = 4 years of undergrad plus 2 years of graduate school).
- Lower costs: graduate-level courses taken as an undergraduate are paid for through the undergraduate block tuition rate.
- Enhanced marketability: many professions now require a master's degree for entry-level positions.
